Looking forward, on 19th January we have the pleasure of attending Arsenal Women vs Chelsea Women at Meadowpark, Borehamwood, for our Arsenal Sister club match day experience.

Interest this year has been phenomenal, with over 100 girls wanting to attend. Unfortunately, only 39 girls are able to take part in the training session before the game, and be a flag bearer or mascot for the match itself. These 39 girls will be chosen at random from those who expressed an interest and your coach will be able to confirm names soon.

All girls who expressed an interest will get a ticket for the match, but because of the sheer numbers we won't be able to offer tickets for parents. If you do want more tickets for the game these can be purchased online from Arsenal.com – they are usually £7 for adults and £3.50 for children if bought in advance. The match is expected to be sell out as it is a top of the table clash, potentially decisive in the race for the Women's Super League title, so please book your tickets soon to avoid disappointment. The Under 14 Blues had a challenging start to the 2019 season as 5 of their first 6 games were played against teams that were previously in higher divisions (all part of the new Pre-Season policy or a Cup game). That said, they acquitted themselves and whilst they struggled to score most weeks, it proved a good experience to bed in the 4 new players into the team. They were not heavily defeated in any game and showed real promise.

Since those games, the Belles have performed well in a tight League, winning 3 games and losing 4. All the defeats were very close and could have gone either way on a different weekend so plenty of positives going into 2020. The Belles have the Division's third highest scorer, in Hannah Baynham, who has scored 6 goals, including a recent hat-trick in a 5-3 win over St Albans.

The Christmas break has come at the wrong time as the Belles have started to show real consistency and strength so hopefully this will continue into the rest of the season. As a treat, after the first win in the League, the tradition is now for the entire team to decamp to McDonald's after training which proved very popular as you can see!
