## **SCHEDULE 1**



## HITCHIN BELLES COVID PROCEDURE AT THE PRIORY SCHOOL

- 1. All adults attending the match should download the NHS covid tracker app if compatible with their phone.
- 2. At the entrance gate to the playing field is the NHS QR code which parents should scan in the NHS app to record their attendance at the venue.
- 3. If the NHS app is not compatible with a phone, there is a separate QR code (not branded NHS) which links to a Google form, parents must instead scan that QR code and record their information on that form.
- 4. For any parents who cannot use either QR code, a link to the Google form is below:

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- 5. Hand sanitizer is provided at the entrance. It is recommended that all players used hand sanitizer prior to, midway and after the game.
- 6. Only one person or carer per child is permitted to attend. No spectators are allowed.
- 7. Visiting team managers must hold a record of the players attending the match, to ensure that players can be identified and contacted if needed.

- 8. Social distancing must be observed in accordance with Government guidance at all times.
- 9. Other procedures applicable to the players will be as per the FA guidance (eg no shaking hands).
